### GOOD STANDING POLICY

At Jurien Bay District High School, the **Good Standing Policy** supports our school values of Respect, Responsibility and Commitment and our clear behaviour standards and expectations;

The Good Standing Policy supports this through acknowledging and rewarding exemplary behaviour, work ethic, attendance and standards of uniform. We believe that learning is enhanced in a welcoming, inclusive, collaborative and caring environment. The Good Standing Policy emphasises the importance of students taking responsibility for the choices they make on a daily basis, which impacts academically and socially on themselves and others. The Good Standing Policy is part of and works in conjunction with our school *Classroom Behaviour Management Process* and aims to provide regular acknowledgement and recognition for the majority of students who consistently behave and act in accordance with the process and *Jurien Bay DHS Classroom Expectations*.

#### To maintain 'Good Standing' students must:

- Comply with the *Jurien Bay DHS Classroom Expectations*
- Comply with the Attendance Policy
- Follow the school Dress Code

'Good Standing' is a status that all JBDHS students are granted at the beginning of each term. It is the responsibility of the student to maintain their good standing. Students with Good Standing are eligible to participate in reward days that occur at the end of each term. Students who lose their Good Standing may lose the privilege to participate in various events throughout the school year. Examples include; excursions, school camps, interschool sporting events, Country Week, sports days, school balls and graduation dinners.

Students who lose their Good Standing will have a fair process to earn back their privileges. Please be aware that further offences that occur whilst on probation will result in the requirements starting over.

Students who maintain their Good Standing will be eligible to access extra-curricular incursions and excursions, school camps, inter-school carnivals in addition to reward activities which will coincide with the end of each term.

The following table outlines exactly why a student's Good Standing would be withdrawn and ways to earn it back.

REASONS	LEVEL AT WHICH LOSS OF GOOD STANDING OCCURS	REQUIREMENTS TO REGAIN PRIVLEDGES	ACTION
Dress Code Infringement	First infringement after a letter of concern has been issued.	10 consecutive school days attended complying with the school dress code	Letter of concern to parent/caregiver on third infringement
Attendance	Unauthorised absences and/or attendance below 85% in any three-week period. Medical evidence will be taken into consideration for absences below 85%	Good standing reinstated after clearing of unexplained absences to satisfaction of School Administration, attendance rising above 85% or at beginning of a new term.	SMS or phone contact to parent/caregiver at point of concern, with a letter of concern issued.
Behaviour	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Any incident of referral to the leadership team for significant negative behaviours.</li> <li>The leadership team will decide whether the referral warrants a loss of good standing.</li> <li>Three significant incidents within one term will result in the loss of good standing for the term.</li> </ul>	10 consecutive days achieving good behaviour with no further incidents of unacceptable behaviour since the last incident.	Contact to parent caregiver each instance of a student losing good standing.
Suspension	First and all subsequent occasions, however a second suspension in a term will result in loss of good standing for the term.	Automatic loss of Good Standing. Restoration dealt with on an individual basis under direction of school admin. Notionally 20 consecutive days of positive behaviour.	Parent interview/case conference on re-entry to school. Two week behaviour contract on re-entry to school.

NOTE;

- Students must have Good Standing to attend school excursions, incursions, camps, social events, interschool carnivals, Good Standing reward days and extra-curricular activities.
- Students will have access to all school based events that are part of the curriculum, regardless of Good Standing Status.
