## **YEAR 12 CHARGES FOR OPTIONAL ACTIVITIES THROUGHOUT THE YEAR**

Charges apply for the provision of extra cost optional activities that are part of an education program. All activities outlined below are optional and if no payment is received, an alternative educational activity will be provided for your child. The School Board recognises the value of these types of activities and seeks to support teachers who coordinate them as part of their teaching programs.

All 2024 extra cost optional activities have been approved by the School Board. The estimated costs provided are at an upper limit and will not exceed this amount. If a particular event does not occur within the school year, no charges for that event will apply.

***Payment of the following extra cost optional charges is not required at the time of finalising payment of 'course charges'. Where staff arrange extra cost optional activities, payment will be requested immediately prior to it happening.***

## **STUDENT ALLOWANCES 2024**

The Secondary Assistance Scheme is available to secondary students whose parents hold Centrelink Family Health Care or Pensioner Concession Cards or Veteran's Affairs Pensioner Concession Cards. The Secondary Assistance Scheme consists of a \$235.00 Educational Program Allowance which is paid directly to the school and a Clothing Allowance of \$115.00 which is paid to the parent.

Students are not eligible for the Secondary Assistance Scheme in the year in which they turn 19 years of age or older and/or if they have previously received the allowance when enrolled at another school in the current year.

## **REFUND OF CHARGES**

When a student transfers to another school, arrangements will be made to forward a pro-rata portion of their 'charges' to their new school. Alternatively, a refund can be arranged. The refunded amount will be based on a pro rata rate as stipulated by the Department of Education.
